

CCRDA Member Responses to the Earthquake in Sulawesi, Indonesia September/October 2018

HPIC

What HPIC is doing:

As the only NGO in Canada with a Drug Establishment License from Health Canada, HPIC is the main recipient for donations of medicines and medical supplies from the Canadian pharmaceutical and healthcare industry. HPIC has pre-positioned emergency medical kits, each containing essential medicines and medical supplies worth approximately \$5,000 and donated by Canadian healthcare industry. These kits are designed for immediate dispatch in emergency situations and are especially valued for their size and versatility. One kit provides up to 600 medical treatments.

What HPIC needs from other organizations:

HPIC needs to contact Canadian or in-country NGO partners working in Sulawesi, Indonesia, in order to identify detailed needs in areas of medicines and medical supplies and to coordinate shipments of medicine and relief supplies to respond to the urgent health needs of those affected by the earthquake and subsequent tsunami in Indonesia.

What HPIC can offer partner organizations:

Sourcing Medicine Donations: HPIC will liaise with the Canadian pharmaceutical and medical supply industry to obtain needed medicines and supplies.

Handling: HPIC will coordinate medicine warehousing and logistics including receiving products, preparing shipments, and providing necessary documents for shipping and customs clearance.

Shipping: Donated medicines and supplies will be airlifted or shipped to locations identified.

World Hope International (Canada)

We are responding to the earthquake and subsequent tsunami in Indonesia. Once we are allowed in country, we will be deploying Fresh Water Production Teams to pump fresh water from Katadyn desalination units in areas that have not yet been reached by the large aid organizations.

We need funds to purchase water filters, solar panels and non-perishable food to distribute.

We are open to working with any partner organizations who are on the ground already, and who may already see a need for a fresh water team to come provide clean drinking water. Our desal units are transportable by commercial airline and we have 50 Canadians trained to operate them.

World Renew

World Renew's International Disaster Response (IDR) staff and partners are responding in Sulawesi after a 7.5 magnitude earthquake and resulting 10-foot tsunami rolled through the island nation on Friday, September 28, 2018. World Renew is well positioned to respond to this crisis through local church partners who are already operational in some of the worst affected communities. World Renew is organizing an expansion of its current earthquake response in Lombok, Indonesia, to include the critical, widespread needs still being uncovered after Friday's devastation on Sulawesi. The response will be a long-term effort and requires much

coordination with both Indonesian and international authorities. Life-saving food, water, and emergency kits will be distributed in the early phase. Temporary and semi-permanent shelters may follow, or latrines with sanitation training to prevent the spread of disease. Financial donations can be made online at worldrenew.net/sulawesi.

Missionaries in Sulawesi will supervise the implementation of the relief plan and the distribution of funds through the seminary.

Compassion

While Compassion has extensive work in the islands that make up Indonesia, our work is somewhat distant from both the earthquake epicenter and the coast landfall location of the tsunami.

Eight of our frontline church partners experienced some degree of impact and just under 50 beneficiaries require help. Our local country office responded with initial recovery, basic relief and minor repairs.

With the scale being such, our relief effort has been handled by a common disaster relief fund. Since we are not normally a relief-based organization, we are not envisioning further disaster recovery work for these incidents in Indonesia.
